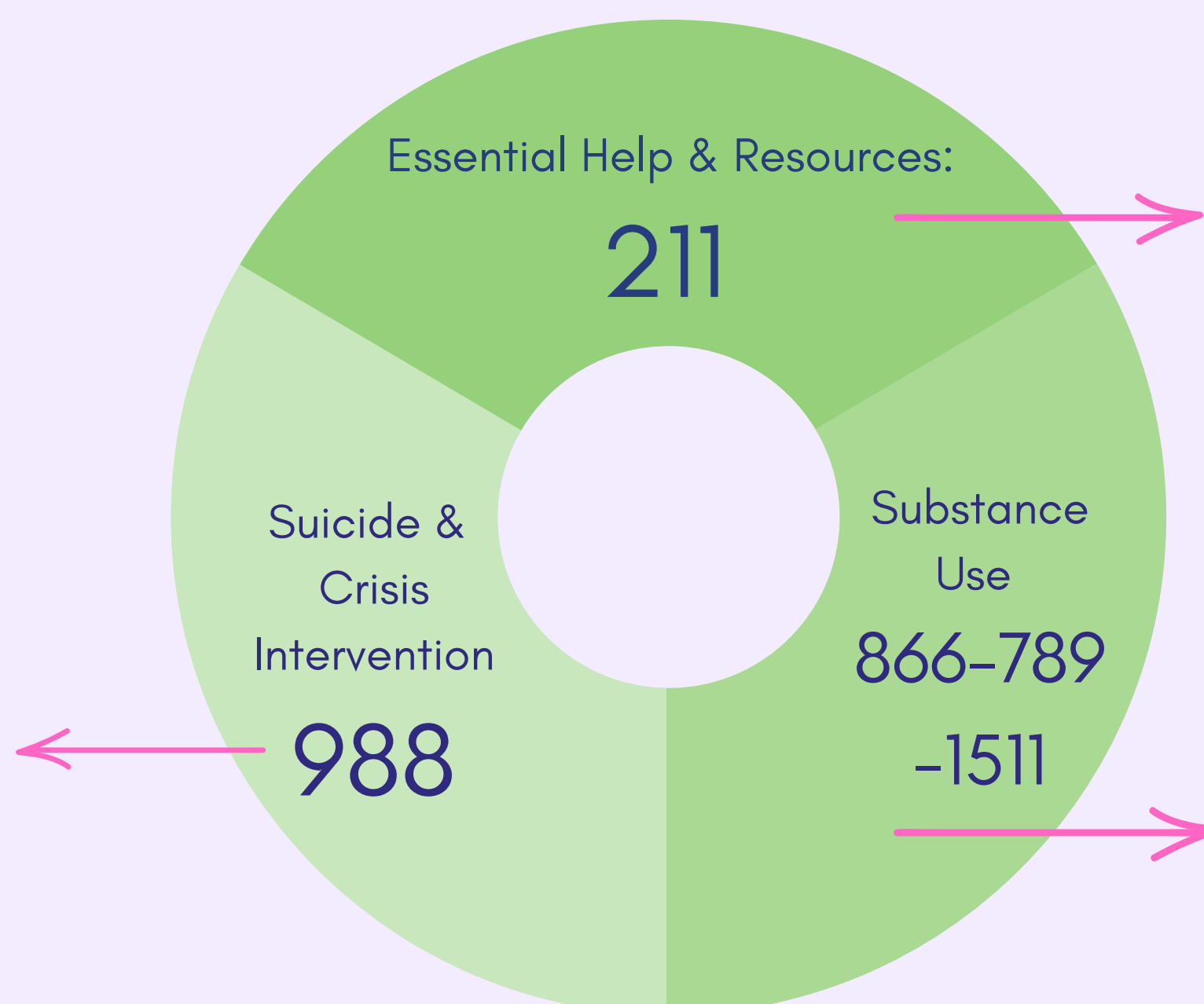

CONTEXT

FIFA World Cup 2026 is being held in Seattle, WA. During mega events such as these, there are often increases in gender-based violence such as sexual assault, trafficking, exploitation, and abuse. As a result, existing response systems for victims and survivors can become strained and capacity to respond to the harm, reduced.

COORDINATION

Good coordination between systems-based advocates, law enforcement, first responders, community-based programs and local government is key. Below are key partners in coordination, particularly in regards to FIFA.

Stronger Together Ending Exploitation Collaborative; Crime Survivor Services; Victim Support Team, CARE Team; Health One; Seattle Police Dept; CEASE within Mayors Office on DV/SA; Human Services Department, Human Trafficking Prevention Initiative

CAPACITY

CEGV and member programs were successful in securing around \$500k in funds during the 2026 Seattle budget. Some of those funds are being prioritized for emergency GBV response during FIFA.

- ↑ Additional funds for shelter, housing, and pre-paid rooms via Reloshare.
- ↑ Additional funds to pay for anticipated overtime and hotline staffing after hours.
- ↑ Additional funds towards survivor driven, flexible financial assistance.
- ↑ Additional funds for targeted outreach, education, coordination, and post-FIFA GBV disclosures and responses.
